You can talk to any adult in school,
we are all here to help!

It is **Mrs Hartley's, Mrs May's, Mrs Bryne's and Mr Neville's** special job to keep you safe - talk to them if you are worried.

You could tell a friend and then go with them to tell an adult.

Talk to someone!

Is someone bullying you?

Has someone been repeatedly saying or doing something to upset and hurt you or make you afraid?
You must tell someone at school so we can help.

Do NOT keep it secret!

Saying funny things to you?

Has someone said something to you or have you heard something that you do not like or upsets you?
You must tell someone at school so we can help you.

Touching you?

Has someone made you feel uncomfortable about how or where they have touched you? You must tell someone at school so we can help you.

Do NOT keep it secret! You MUST tell someone

You MUST tell someone!

Trying to give you tablets, cigarettes, drugs or alcohol?

Has someone asked you if you want a tablet or to smoke a cigarette, or have a drink of something and you do not know what it is? Do not eat, drink or smoke what they are giving to you. You must tell someone at school so we can help you.

Hitting, punching or smacking you?

Has someone hit, punched or smacked you or hurt you in anyway? You must tell someone at school so we can help you.

You MUST tell someone!

E-Safety

Do NOT keep it secret!

Has someone sent you unkind messages or threatened you?
Have you seen anything that has upset or worried you?
Has someone on the internet asked you to do anything that made you feel uncomfortable? You must tell someone at school so we can help you.

TALK PANTS AND YOU'VE GOT IT COVERED!

P RIVATES ARE PRIVATE

Parts of your body covered by underwear are private. No one should ask to see, or touch them. No one should ask you to touch or look at parts of their body that are covered by underwear. Sometimes doctors, nurses or family members might have to. But they should always explain why, and ask if it's OK first.



A LWAYS REMEMBER YOUR BODY BELONGS TO YOU

It's your body, no one else's. No one should make you do things that make you feel embarrassed or uncomfortable. If anyone tries, tell an adult you trust.



N O MEANS NO

You have the right to say 'no' – even to a family member or someone you love. Remember, you're in control of your body and your feelings are important.



T ALK ABOUT SECRETS THAT UPSET YOU

Secrets shouldn't make you feel upset or worried. If they do, tell an adult you trust. You will never get into trouble for sharing a secret that upsets you.



S PEAK UP. SOMEONE CAN HELP

Talk about stuff that makes you worried or upset. An adult you trust will listen, and be able to help. It doesn't have to be a family member. It can be a teacher or a friend's parent – or even ChildLine.
