If we are worried about you and your safety, we cannot keep secrets but we will do our best to keep you safe.

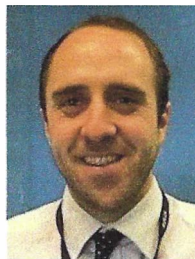
We provide a safe environment for children to learn in and we want to ensure that children remain safe, at home as well as at school.

Talk To Someone!

Is someone bullying you?

Has someone been repeatedly saying or doing something to upset and hurt you, or make you afraid?
You must tell someone at school so we can help you.

Do NOT keep it secret!

Saying funny things to you

Has someone said something to you or have you heard something that you do not like or upsets you?
You must tell someone at school so we can help you.

Touching you

Has someone made you feel uncomfortable about how or where they have touched you?
You must tell someone at school so we can help you.

Do NOT keep it secret!
You MUST tell someone

Trying to give you tablets, cigarettes, drugs or alcohol

You MUST tell someone !

Has someone asked you if you want a tablet or to smoke a cigarette, or have a drink of something and you do not know what it is?
Do not eat, drink or smoke what they are giving you
You must tell someone at school so we can help you.

Hitting, punching or smacking you

Has someone hit, punched or smacked you or hurt you in anyway?
You must tell someone at school so we can help you.

You MUST tell someone !

Do NOT keep it secret!

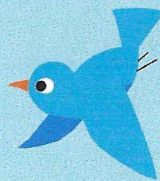
Has anyone sent you unkind messages or threatened you?

P RIVATES ARE PRIVATE

Your underwear covers up your private parts and no one should ask to see or touch them. Sometimes a doctor, nurse or family members might have to. But they should always explain why, and ask you if it's OK first. Remember, what's in your pants belongs only to you.



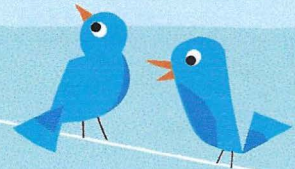
A LWAYS REMEMBER YOUR BODY BELONGS TO YOU

No one should ever make you do things that make you feel embarrassed or uncomfortable. If someone asks to see or tries to touch you underneath your underwear say 'NO' – and tell someone you trust and like to speak to.



N O MEANS NO

You always have the right to say 'no' – even to a family member or someone you love. You're in control of your body and the most important thing is how YOU feel. If you want to say 'No', it's your choice.



T ALK ABOUT SECRETS THAT UPSET YOU

There are good secrets and bad secrets. If a secret makes you feel sad or worried, it's bad – and you should tell an adult you trust about it straight away.



S PEAK UP, SOMEONE CAN HELP

It's always good to talk about stuff that makes you upset. If you're worried, go and tell a grown up you trust – like a family member, teacher or one of your friend's parents. They'll say well done for speaking out and help make everything OK. You can also call Childline on 0800 1111 and someone will always be there to listen.
