PRE-SCHOOL

Our Reading focus this half term has been based on, Franklin wants a pet. The children absolutely loved sharing photos of their pets and their knowledge of how to look after them. The children had a visit from Simon at Animal HQ this half term which enabled them to meet lots of different animals that they may not have experienced up close before.

It was a fabulous experience, the children were able to see and touch soft and cuddly animals such as dogs, guinea pig and rabbits as well as comparing how they felt to snakes, lizards and stick insects.

The children behaved amazingly showing care and respect for all the different animals as they learnt about how to look after them.


















Our most recent learning experience has had a focus on the Science aspect of Understanding the World.

Our learning question is all about our blue planet.

In particular we are thinking about how we can make a difference and share this message with others.

We are building on our previous learning about minibeasts and their natural habitats.

The children have learnt about how damaging sea pollution can be to the wonderful sea creatures that live there.

We have been thinking about how we can help and have learnt about recycling. We have been encouraged to engage in lots of different activities linked to this within our provision.



Year 1 have been enthusiastic designers and have worked collaboratively to design a catapult that will hit a target. We have had to think about how to make improvements to our catapults in order to ensure that they are more effective about hitting the target. The children were very excited and cheered supportively when anyone was near to the target. We have also been super keen scientists, learning about 'Plants' and how to keep them healthy. We have learnt about deciduous and evergreen trees and how they differ. As scientists we have learnt how to do a simple test and explain what we are testing and why.












Year 2 have been keen scientists this term. Our big question has been 'How can we support more wildlife in our school area?'. We have been undertaking a scientific investigation which has involved putting six different materials into our allotment areas. The materials we chose were: rubber, plastic, wood, metal and a pillowcase. We wanted to find out which material would attract the most minibeasts and encourage the most plant growth. We enjoyed learning about what a prediction is and made some of our own about the outcome of this investigation. Running through our curriculum this term, is our gateway of Leadership. As a class we chose our example of Leadership to be Lewis Hamilton. This is because he said when he was young that one day he would become a famous racing car driver. He acted on what he once said which shows that he is a strong leader and is determined. Well done Year 2!















This half-term Year 3 have been designers and scientists! We started by learning about what the body needs to grow, discussing the different food groups and nutrients they provide us with. We discussed a balanced diet and the importance of proportions. We ended the learning experience by making our own healthy fruit ice lollies, which went down a treat!

In science we have been learning about what plants need to grow. We investigated this by planting our own seeds and taking away a crucial thing they need, such as light or water. We have enjoyed filming our daily video diary, talking about the facts we have learnt.





This half-term Year 4 have developed their DT skills. Our big question was 'What type of pizza could Wayne trial in the







kitchen'? We learnt all about minerals and vitamins and the different foods we find these in. In pairs we surveyed other children in the school to find out what type of pizza they would like for lunch. Working collaboratively, we identified different cross contamination scenarios and explained how we could prevent these. This was really important for when we created our own pizzas! We made our own pizza bases using flour, yeast, water, oil and sugar and then added our favourite toppings.

Year 4 have been very lucky this half term as we went down to All Saints Church and spoke to the people from 'The Fisherman's Mission'. They taught us how to be safe in the water, what to do when we needed help and even let us touch real fish!


Police Officer Ant and Keira also visited us in the classroom and talked to us about how we can be safe in our communities and online. They even brought the police van for us to go in!





Throughout our learning this term, Class 5 have focused on developing their skills in working collaboratively. We began by considering the importance of resolving conflict and have returned to that when necessary during our Design Technology and Science journeys. Children in class 5 worked brilliantly together in the challenge they were set for design technology – a transport system to get crops from the top of a mountain to the markets at the bottom. This was based on a problem faced by farmers in Nepal. Our science journey has required us to develop our skills in creating hypotheses based on our prior experience and we've needed to repeat investigations into materials to ensure reliability. We've created rust, we've checked how materials conduct heat and electricity, we've found out if materials are soluble or insoluble and learnt at our time at Brixham College out to separate materials from a solution. Not all science investigations have gone as we'd expected so we've truly had the opportunity to show determination.












Year 6 have been designers this term. They were asked, as part of their Design and Technology learning to design and make ornaments with a sea-theme to display in our local church for their 'Sea Week' celebrations. The children learnt how to critically evaluate against a specification; how to identify how sustainable materials in a product are and how to reinforce and strengthen a 3D framework.

Year 6 really enjoyed learning the principles of effective design: setting objectives, gathering ideas and developing concepts in order to develop plans or specifications for a particular outcome.

They also used a variety of materials, tools and technological applications, and had the opportunity to use these to complete practical tasks.

After this, they were able to evaluate products effectively, identifying strengths and weaknesses and reflecting on what elements could be changed to improve the outcome and what they would do differently.
