Harriet Tubman was born into slavery in America. She escaped from slavery and fought hard to stop it. Following her escape, she went on to 13 missions to rescue other slaves and lead them to freedom.

Walter Tull was the first black British Army officer and first black British Professional Footballer. He was born in England and played for Tottenham Hotspur.

Bill Miller was the Deputy Mayor of Plymouth, he was also known as the 'Local Hero' and helped to build houses for black people during the war who were left homeless.

Mary Seacole, a nurse who helped support British soldiers during the Crimean War. She set up the 'British Hotel' behind the lines and nursed the injured soldiers back to health.
